David Gerreis (Running for President)



County: Anne Arundel County

What made you decide to run for office? If you are an incumbent, what made you decide to run again?

I am currently the President of MAEO and I have decided to run for re-election because MAEO has made many positive strides over the last two years including launching the Connect24 newsletter, holding cost-effective conferences with interesting speakers on topics related to managing elections and professional development, and becoming a forum for the local

Boards of Elections to discuss best practices and brainstorm better ways to run elections. MAEO is filled with great people who truly care about the election profession and it would be an honor to continue to serve as President.

How long have you been a MAEO member?

I've been a member of MAEO since 2005. I was first elected to the MAEO Board of Directors in 2010. I was elected President in 2016.

What is your vision and number one priority for MAEO?

My number one priority for MAEO is to finish the Pay Raise and Job Reclassification Project. The single most immediate problem facing the MAEO community is that the opportunities for career advancement are very limited and the pay scale for election professionals is beneath other professional departments in the state system. The staff members at the local Boards deserve better compensation for their work and they deserve the opportunity to advance up the career ladder in elections. We need to create more job classifications between Election Deputy Director and Election Supervisor II or Election Information System Specialist.

Over the past two years, we have worked hard to address this problem. The Personnel Committee has done a great job developing a relationship with the Department of Budget and Management, drafting new position specifications, and building a scalable framework for career advancement that benefits all LBEs, regardless of their size.

I am pleased to report the new position specifications and job classifications are currently under review at the Department of Budget and Management. We are close to implementing an election career path with higher pay and greater opportunities for local Board employees. Finishing this project is my number one priority.

After we are successful, we will work with the LBEs that do not operate within the state personnel system to implement similar positions and job classifications in their personnel systems as well.

How do you feel you can improve MAEO and make it more relevant?

Over the past two years, we made great strides to improve MAEO and make it more relevant, however, I have many lessons learned about how MAEO is managed I will build on, including increasing the use of Smartsheets to coordinate the activities of the MAEO Committees and MAEO projects.

Since I've been President, we have changed the way we manage the conferences including using Google Sheets and Smartsheets to keep track of conference costs, scheduling, and important deadlines. I will expand on these lessons learned and continue to implement a more project-management based system to manage the MAEO Conferences.

I also want to increase the coordination between the MAEO and SBE so that we're working together to hold the most efficient and easy-to-manage elections in the nation. In this regard, we are working with SBE to hold in 2019 MAEO Conference and Biennial together.

Finally, the current MAEO Board of Directors has repeatedly observed that the MAEO Bylaws are out-of-date, frequently unclear or contradictory, and full of loopholes. I will launch a project to update and revise the MAEO Bylaws by inviting representatives from large, medium, and small LBEs, as well as representatives from every region of Maryland to join the Constitution and Bylaws Committee with the goal of closing loopholes, clarifying language, and making the Bylaws current.

Please name 1 or 2 items you would like to accomplish during your 2-year term.

If re-elected, my highest priority action item is to finish the Pay Raise and Job Reclassification Project. I know from personal experience how hard it is to buy a house and start a family on the income from a career in elections. If managing elections is a profession, then we need to be compensated like other professionals in the state personnel system. We need a career path so talented employees can grow from entry level to Election Director. Successfully finishing this project will be the number one priority of my second term as the President of MAEO.

How do you feel you can improve MAEO and make it more relevant?



Six years ago, I introduced and implemented something called the Election Technology Users Group, a discussion group for all Maryland election tech folk, hosted on Yammer.com. The purpose of the ETUG was to allow a question to be posted or a discussion started that <u>all</u> members would see, that anybody could respond to, and that everyone could follow. I felt it was a very efficient way to share information and knowledge, without having to rely on copying or forwarding or 'replying all'. It was quite active, productive, and useful for a time. ETUG lasted about a year and half and was eventually discontinued because of security and proprietary information concerns. I would very much like to start from scratch, do the research, see what's available nowadays, and try to implement this again.

There are dozens of associations similar to MAEO around the country, associations of election officials, county clerks, or registrars. Many states also have county associations, where elections are one of many priorities. Some of these associations are quite active, some less so. Some are more successful, some less so. Some agendas are quite similar to MAEO's, some are quite different. I have already compiled a list of many of these organizations. I believe there are genuine opportunities for sharing, learning, and achieving results with these peer associations.
